DEVELOPMENTAL HIP DYSPLASIA (DDH)

- Hip dysplasia refers to an abnormality in the development in the size, shape, orientation, or organization of the femoral head, acetabulum, or both.
- DDH is a silent condition and is time sensitive. The most common congenital anomaly of the lower extremity. It ranges from severe to mild acetabular insufficiency to frank dislocation
- Occurs in 1:1000 births
